Rollan Theodore "Rollie" Anderson, 85, 8 Greenway, died Tuesday, Oct. 5, 1999, in a Minot medical center.

He was born Jan. 1, 1914, in (D o g d e n) Butte, to Theodore and C l a r a Anderson. He was raised in Balfour and in Minot, where they family

moved in 1919. He attended school in Minot and graduated from Minot High School in 1932. He was a semi-professional boxer and a jockey and trick rider at area fairs and was employed by Jim Stearns Amusement Co. as a young adult.

He served in the Army from 1940 to 1946 in the Pacific Theater. He married Florence Moore Sept. 19, 1944, in Blytheville, Ark. He returned to Minot following his discharge, where he established Capital Vending Co. in 1950. He owned and operated that company until his son, Ron, assumed control of the family business. He retired in 1978.

He was a member of First Lutheran Church, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and was a life member of the Elks Lodge and the Minot Curling Club, all Minot. He was a former member of the Minot Eagles Aerie and of the Minot Country Club.
