Luella Marie Guddall, the daughter of Sam and Minnie (Iverson) Guddall, was born March 26, 1909, in Thor, Iowa. She passed away Thursday, April 10, 2003, at the Good Samaritan Center in Estherville, Iowa, at the age of 94 years.

She attended school in Thor and graduated from Eagle Grove High School. After receiving her teacher's certificate from what is now the University of Northern Iowa, she taught at several one-room schools before moving to Dolliver, Iowa, where she taught in the Dolliver Consolidated School.

Lue married William C. Stow of Dolliver on July 30, 1937. The couple had six children. Lue worked in the family business, Stow Grain Company, for many years. Later she worked at the L.M.
