

Inga Guttrud

WILLOW CITY—Funeral services were held at First Lutheran church here today for Mrs. Inga Guttrud, 76, resident of the Willow City and Towner areas since territorial days. She died June 9 in a hospital at Fargo, following a lingering heart ailment.

Rev. Alton Hillestrand, assisted by Rev. E. A. Stouland of Dunseith, conducted the services. Burial was in the Sandhills cemetery near Barton. The pallbearers: Albert and Henry Anderson, Walter Prellwitz, Thomas Thompson, and Fred and Wesley Walker.

Mrs. Guttrud is survived by a son, Henry, of Towner, and by two daughters, Mrs. Roy Cameron (Sophie) and Mrs. Mildred Holly of Fargo. She also leaves two brothers, Gilbert Hagen of Willow City and John Hagen of Bottineau, and two sisters, Mrs. Julia Moore of Mill Valley, Calif., and Mrs. Ida Folkert of Rochester, Minn. Five brothers and sisters had preceded her in death.

Inga Hagen was born April 6, 1884, at Portland in the Red River valley. In 1887 she came with her family to a farm west of Willow City. She was confirmed in the Lutheran church at Willow City.

On June 29, 1905, she and Sam H. Guttrud were married, and they settled on a farm 13 miles north of Towner. Mr. Guttrud died in June, 1942.

Since 1947 Mrs. Guttrud had spent part of her time on her farm and part with her children. She had been in the habit of staying on the farm during the summer months.
